The Jaguars opened the season by scoring first in their initial game under Gus Bradley, but Kansas City quickly built momentum to claim a 28-2 opening day win. In a game that featured 21 punts, the Jaguars special teams accounted for the first points when J.T. Thomas blocked Dustin Colquitt's first punt through the back of the end zone. The Chiefs scored touchdowns on three of their next five possessions, with the first two set up by a 36-yard punt return to the Jacksonville 24-yard line and a 32-yard interception return to the Jaguars' 21. The Chiefs' longest drive of the day covered 57 yards in eight plays and ended with Jamaal Charles' two-yard scoring run for a 21-2 halftime lead. The Jacksonville offense was forced to punt six times in the first half, at which point the Chiefs held a total yardage advantage of 170 to 49, 11 first downs to three, and a rushing advantage of 92 yards to 29. In all, the Jaguars punted a team-record 11 times in 15 possessions and Kansas City punted 10 times in 14 series. The lone second-half points came on a Tamba Hali interception which he returned 10 yards for a touchdown early in the fourth quarter. Until their final two possessions the Jaguars failed to move the ball beyond their own 36-yard line. Maurice Jones-Drew, playing in the 100th game of his career, was held to 45 yards on 15 carries with his longest run of the day being 10 yards. The Chiefs sacked Blaine Gabbert six times and allowed him to complete just 16 of 35 passes before he injured his throwing hand on the final series.

Chad Henne started for the injured Blaine Gabbert and completed 25 of 38 passes, but the Raiders rushed for 226 yards in pounding out a 19-9 victory. Darren McFadden led the way for Oakland with 129 rushing yards and a 6.9-yard rushing average in addition to a team-leading four receptions for 28 yards, and Terrelle Pryor added 50 rushing yards and 129 passing. After a Jacksonville three-and-out, the first of six on the day, the Raiders scored on their first possession on a Marcel Reece 11-yard run. After both teams exchanged punts twice, the Jaguars put together their best drive of the day, marching 78 yards in 15 plays to set up Josh Scobee's 27-yard field goal in the second quarter. Sebastian Janikowski then missed his first field goal try from 35 yards but made the first of his four field goals on the final play of the first half for a 10-3 halftime lead. The Raiders opened the third quarter with a 12-play, 69-yard drive capped by a 30-yard Janikowski field goal. After three more Jacksonville punts Janikowski hit two 29-yard field goals for a 19-3 advantage midway through the fourth quarter. The lone turnover of the day - a McFadden fumble recovered by Dwight Lowery - set up the Jaguars' first touchdown of the season, a 13-yard Henne pass to Clay Harbor with 2:53 remaining to create the final score of 19-9. The Jaguars had two red zone possessions resulting in a field goal and a touchdown, while Oakland had five red zone drives with a touchdown, a missed field goal and three field goals. Maurice Jones-Drew suffered a sprained ankle midway through the second quarter and was unable to return.

Playing their second straight game on the west coast, the Jaguars struggled early before scoring 17 second-half points in a lopsided 45-17 loss in Seattle. The Seahawks dominated from the start, scoring on four of their six first-half possessions while holding the Jaguars to five punts and an interception in their first six. Russell Wilson, who completed 14 of his first 18 pass attempts including four touchdowns, connected with tight end Zach Miller for the first two scores on passes of one and four yards. Steven Hauschka's 21-yard field goal and Wilson's 11-yard touchdown pass to Sidney Rice gave Seattle a 24-0 lead at halftime, at which time Seattle led in total yards 275 to 52 and in first downs 16 to four. Jacksonville took advantage of Wilson's lone interception in the third quarter when Paul Posluszny picked off the deflection and returned it 10 yards to the Seattle two-yard line. Maurice Jones-Drew pounded it in from there to make it 31-7. Tarvaris Jackson replaced Wilson with 3:54 remaining in the third quarter and he completed all three passes on his first series including a 35-yard touchdown pass to a diving Doug Baldwin at the goal line. Josh Scobee's 33-yard field goal made it 38-10 at the end of the period and each team tacked on a fourth-quarter touchdown - Jordan Todman on a three-yard run for Jacksonville and Jackson on a five-yard run for Seattle. Cecil Shorts III was a bright spot for the Jaguars with eight receptions for 143 yards, including a 59-yarder from Chad Henne, while Johnathan Cyprien had a sack and a forced fumble and Jason Babin got his second sack of the season.

The Jaguars got off to a promising start, taking an early 3-0 lead on Josh Scobee's 53-yard field goal to cap their second possession after their first series ended in an interception. The Jacksonville defense started strong, holding the Colts to two punts and an interception by Will Blackmon on their first three drives, but after that Indianapolis scored three offensive touchdowns and three field goals and held the Jaguars to five straight three-and-outs for a 37-3 win. The Colts tied the score at 3-3 at the beginning of the second quarter on Adam Vinatieri's 22-yard field goal, and five plays later Darius Butler gave Indianapolis its first lead at 10-3 with his 41-yard interception return for a touchdown. Trent Richardson capped the Colts' next series, which featured a 50-yard run by Donald Brown, with a one-yard scoring run for a 17-3 lead. A 46-yard field goal by Vinatieri made it 20-3 at the half, and as had been the case in earlier games the Jaguars trailed in many halftime statistics, including three first downs to the Colts' 13, and 69 total yards to 238 with 30 rushing yards and 39 passing yards. In the third quarter Andrew Luck threw a 31-yard touchdown pass to Coby Fleener, followed by a 12-play, 72-yard scoring drive on which Reggie Wayne caught a five-yard pass from Luck that made it 34-3 at the end of the period. Vinatieri tacked on a 28-yard field goal in the final two minutes of the game to end the scoring. Blaine Gabbert played for the first time since opening day and completed 17 of 32 passes for 179 yards, while Maurice Jones-Drew was held to 23 yards on 13 carries. Mercedes Lewis saw his first action of the season but re-injured his calf in the first quarter and did not return.

For the second week in a row the Jaguars scored first and showed promise early, but turnovers proved costly in a 34-20 loss to the Rams on the road. Injuries also took a toll as Luke Joeckel suffered a broken ankle and Blaine Gabbert left the game with a hamstring injury. Justin Blackmon made his season debut after serving a four-game suspension, and his impact was immediate as he took his first pass from Gabbert 67 yards for the game's first touchdown. St. Louis evened the score two series later when Matt Giordano intercepted Gabbert and returned the pick 82 yards for a touchdown. The Jaguars closed out the first quarter with a 48-yard Josh Scobee field goal but the Rams then answered with a 32-yarder by Greg Zuerlein. Two plays later a fumble by Clay Harbor was recovered and returned by Darian Stewart to the Jacksonville 16, and it took just one play for Sam Bradford to find Lance Kendricks with a 16-yard touchdown pass, giving the Rams their first lead of the day which they would not relinquish. At the end of the first half St. Louis increased the lead to 14 points on a Bradford-to-Austin Pettis scoring pass for a 24-10 halftime lead. On the first series of the second half the Rams went three-and-out and Chris Pronski partially blocked Johnny Hekker's punt, giving the Jaguars the ball at the St. Louis 25. The Jaguars advanced to the five and settled for a 23-yard field goal by Scobee, but on the play they accepted an offsides penalty against the Rams which gave them a fourth-and-goal at the two-yard line. Gabbert threw incomplete into the end zone, but offsetting penalties gave the Jaguars one more play and Gabbert was then intercepted by James Laurinaitis to end the scoring threat. A 34-yard Scobee field goal in the third quarter and a 37-yarder by Zuerlein made it 27-13 early in the fourth period. Jacksonville got within a touchdown of the lead when Chad Henne threw four yards to Cecil Shorts to make the score 27-20 with 10:22 left. A 31-yard Bradford touchdown pass to Pettis on the Rams' next possession capped the scoring.

In their best outing to date, the Jaguars challenged the undefeated Broncos and stayed within two points of the lead midway through the third quarter before falling 35-19. Justin Blackmon sparked the Jacksonville offense with 14 receptions for 190 yards, making up for the loss of Cecil Shorts to a shoulder injury on the third play of the game. But the Broncos were led by Knowshon Moreno's three rushing touchdowns and his seven receptions for 62 yards. Denver took a 14-0 lead in the first quarter on Peyton Manning touchdown passes to Julius Thomas and Wes Welker, but the Jaguars did all of the scoring in the second period with two Josh Scobee field goals from 50 and 30 yards and a 59-yard interception return for a touchdown by Paul Posluszny in the final minute of the half. A failed two-point conversion kept the Jaguars from evening the score and left it at 14-12 at halftime. The Broncos opened the second half with an 80-yard drive capped by Moreno's first scoring run, but the Jaguars answered with an 80-yard drive of their own, highlighted by a Maurice Jones-Drew 28-yard run and three Chad Henne completions, and Jones-Drew's five-yard touchdown run made it 21-19. Denver responded on the next series with another 80-yard touchdown drive for Moreno's second score, and on their next possession they drove to the Jacksonville four-yard line where a fumbled snap was recovered by Mike Harris. But the Jaguars failed to take advantage when Henne was intercepted five plays later, leading to Moreno's third touchdown of the day for a 35-19 lead. The Jaguars' final two possessions ended in a failed fourth down and an interception. The two quarterbacks had similar completion percentages and yards, with Henne completing 27 of 42 for 303 yards and two interceptions, and Manning completing 28 of 42 for 295 yards with two touchdowns and one interception.

Playing in London's Wembley Stadium for the first time, the Jaguars struggled through a lopsided first half en route to a 42-10 loss to the 49ers. Jacksonville was forced to punt on each of its first four possessions and ran 18 plays, while San Francisco used 32 plays to score four touchdowns on its first four drives of the day. Frank Gore began the scoring with the first of his two touchdown runs, a 19-yard dash up the middle on the opening eight-play, 76-yard series. Colin Kaepernick got the first of his two scoring runs next, capping another eight-play, 80-yard drive. Kaepernick threw a two-yard touchdown pass to Vernon Davis to finish off the third possession after 10 plays and 72 yards, and his second rushing score, from nine yards out, came in the middle of the second quarter and boosted the 49ers' lead to 28-0. The Jaguars finally scored with 10 seconds remaining in the first half on a 38-yard Josh Scobee field goal to finish a 12-play, 60-yard series. By that time the 49ers had several statistical advantages, including first downs (17 to seven), total yards (262 to 106) rushing yards (115 to 30) and plays in opponent territory (25 to seven). In the third quarter the Jaguars got rolling with a 15-play march, highlighted by a 30-yard Maurice Jones-Drew run, to the San Francisco six-yard line, but the drive stalled there when Chad Henne threw incomplete on third and fourth down. On the ensuing possession Gore fumbled when hit by Jason Babin and Russell Allen recovered the loose ball at the San Francisco 28. Three plays later Henne hit Mike Brown with a 29-yard touchdown pass to make it 28-10. Gore scored his second touchdown on the next series after a 47-yard kickoff return by Anthony Dixon and a 41-yard run by Kendall Hunter on first down. The Jaguars' next series ended when Mercedes Lewis caught a six-yard pass from Henne but then fumbled, with Dan Skuda returning the fumble 47 yards for a 49ers touchdown to end the scoring at 42-10 early in the final period. San Francisco's four touchdowns on its first four possessions marked the first time in Jaguars history an opponent did so. The Jaguars rushed for less than 100 yards for the eighth straight game.

Claiming their first victory under Head Coach Gus Bradley and General Manager Dave Caldwell, the Jaguars played their best game to date to claim a 29-27 win in Nashville. A wild fourth quarter featured five scoring plays, with three by the Titans offense and two by the Jaguars defense. On the day the Jacksonville defense had four takeaways and a safety, setting up 19 points, and the unit set the tone on Tennessee's first play when Paul Posluszny forced and recovered a Chris Johnson fumble at the Titans' 19-yard line. Maurice Jones-Drew's six-yard blast into the end zone gave the Jaguars an early 7-0 lead, and two Josh Scobee field goals from 32 and 44 yards made 13-0 early in the second quarter. Titans quarterback Jake Locker left the game midway through the second quarter with a foot injury, and Ryan Fitzpatrick directed a touchdown drive on his first series, hitting Taylor Thompson on Tennessee's final play of the first half to narrow the lead to 13-7. Both teams scored on their first possession of the second half, with the Jaguars marching 79 yards in eight plays to set up Jordan Todman's five-yard touchdown run, followed by Tennessee's 11-play series ending in a 39-yard Rob Bironas field goal to make it a ten-point game at 20-10. Bironas' second field goal, which made it 20-13, was set up by a Chad Henne interception at the Jacksonville 32. After Jacksonville downed a Bryan Anger punt at the Tennessee one-yard line the Titans were penalized for holding in their end zone, resulting in a safety and a nine-point Jaguars lead at 22-13. On their next possession the Titans drove 72 yards in just five plays, with Fitzpatrick running in from the four to narrow the score to 22-20 with 4:15 left in the game. The next Titans possession resulted in another score from the Jaguars defense as Will Blackmon stripped Fitzpatrick and ran 21 yards for a touchdown and a 29-20 lead. Tennessee responded again, this time covering 82 yards in 12 plays with Fitzpatrick hitting Delanie Walker with a 14-yard touchdown pass with 40 seconds remaining to make it a two-point game again, 29-27. Jacksonville then recovered the Titans' onside kick and ran out the clock. The win snapped a 13-game losing streak for the Jaguars.

From there the teams took turns punting until 1:55 remained in the first half when Rashard Mendenhall ran five yards for a touchdown to knot the score at 14-14. On the final play of the half Josh Scobee attempted a 60-yard field goal, which would have been a franchise record, but the kick missed wide left. The Cardinals wasted no time in taking control of the game after halftime, scoring on their first two possessions to take a 24-14 lead. First, a good goal line stand by the Jaguars defense forced a 21-yard Jay Feely field goal, and on the Cardinals' next series Palmer connected with Michael Floyd on a 91-yard touchdown pass. After both teams punted several more times Henne was intercepted and the Cardinals took over at the Jacksonville 22, setting up Feely's 32-yard field goal which made it 27-14 midway through the fourth quarter. The Jaguars failed on a fourth-down play on their next drive, and then Henne was intercepted to end the Jaguars' final possession of the afternoon. Noble's 62-yard touchdown was the first reception of his career. Bryan Anger dropped a career-best six of his eight punts inside the Arizona 20.

The Jaguars started strong and turned in season-highs in rushing yards and possession time while not allowing a touchdown to claim their second intradivision road win in three weeks, 13-6 in Houston. On the game's opening drive the Jaguars marched 75 yards in 10 plays with Maurice Jones-Drew slicing in from the one for a 7-0 lead. The Texans were forced to punt on each of their first five possessions, including four consecutive three-and-outs. The only scoring in the second quarter was a 30-yard Josh Scobee field goal and a 49-yarder by Randy Bullock, which made it 10-3 at the half. Houston threatened when the third quarter began, driving from their own 15 to a first-and-goal at the Jacksonville eight-yard line, but the Jaguars defense stiffened at the two and Houston had to settle for a 20-yard field goal. The Jaguars answered with a 13-play drive to set up a 49-yard field goal try by Scobee, but the kick was blocked by J.J. Watt and Houston took over at midfield. Advancing to the Jacksonville 40, the Texans were stopped on fourth-and-one at the start of the fourth quarter. Scobee booted a 53-yard field goal midway through the period for a 13-6 lead. Both teams punted on their next possession before Houston's final series began at their own 20 with no time outs and 1:50 remaining in the game. They advanced to Jacksonville's 41, and with 45 second left Case Keenum was intercepted by Ryan Davis to seal the Jaguars victory. The Jaguars' 118 rushing yards and 33:41 possession time were their best of the season, and Houston's 11 first downs and 218 total yards were the fewest by a Jaguars opponent. The game marked the Jaguars' first back-to-back road wins since 2008, and for the third consecutive week they scored a touchdown on their first possession. Maurice Jones-Drew scored for the third straight week and finished with a season-best 84 rushing yards. In a game that saw five lead changes and two thrilling touchdown passes in the closing minutes, the Jaguars fought back to claim their second straight win and third consecutive on the road, 32-28 in Cleveland. A turning point in the game was the second quarter, in which Jacksonville forced three straight turnovers and scored three straight times, turning a 14-7 deficit into a 20-14 halftime lead. Cleveland scored first on Willis McGahee's one-yard run on the Browns' first drive, and the Jaguars answered with an eight-play, 80-yard series capped by a Chad Henne-to-Clay Harbor 18-yard touchdown pass. A 21-yard pass from Brandon Weeden to Josh Gordon made it 14-7 Cleveland early in the second quarter, and after both teams punted twice the quarter got interesting. Johnathan Cyrien intercepted Weeden at the Cleveland 44 and returned it to the 17, setting up the first touchdown pass of Maurice Jones-Drew's career, covering eight yards to Mercedes Lewis and tying the score at 14-14. On Cleveland's next play Weeden was picked off again, this time by Dwayne Gratz. That set up a 44-yard field goal by Josh Scobee to give Jacksonville its first lead at 17-14. On the ensuing possession Cleveland turned the ball over again when Jason Babin sacked Weeden and forced a fumble which Sen'Derrick Marks returned to the Browns' 18-yard line with five seconds left in the half, setting up Scobee's 36-yard field goal that made it 20-14. When the second half began Cleveland regained the lead at 21-20 with a 10-play, 80-yard drive. That one-point margin was later erased when a high snap over Weeden's head, which he kicked out of the end zone, resulted in a safety and a 22-21 Jacksonville lead. Scobee's 25-yard field goal gave the Jaguars a 25-21 advantage with 4:14 remaining, but it was short-lived when on the next play Weeden hit Gordon with a 95-yard catch-and-run touchdown to put Cleveland ahead 28-25 with 3:54 left in the game. Henne methodically directed a nine-play, 80-yard series and capped with a 20-yard pass to Cecil Shorts in the corner of the end zone for a 32-28 lead with 40 seconds remaining. The Browns were unable to score before running out of time. Gordon finished with 10 receptions for 261 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Browns, but the Jaguars threw for three touchdowns and capitalized with 13 points on three turnovers in addition to the safety and three sacks.

Claiming their third consecutive victory and first home win of the season, the Jaguars downed Houston 27-20 for their third division win in four weeks and first sweep of the Texans since 2009. In their only prime time game the Jaguars relied on a fast start for a 14-0 lead, their largest of the season. Maurice Jones-Drew turned in his first 100-yard rushing game of the year and the defense got three sacks and two interceptions to improve to 4-9 with four wins in five weeks. For the fourth time in those five weeks the Jaguars scored a touchdown on their opening possession, with Chad Henne driving the offense 80 yards in 13 plays and hitting Marcedes Lewis with a one-yard scoring pass. While the defense forced Houston to punt on its first three possessions, the Jaguars scored again to make it 14-0 on their third series, which covered 86 yards in just four plays including two Houston penalties, ending with a six-yard catch by Cecil Shorts in the end zone. The Texans scored in the final two minutes of the first half on a Case Keenum-to-Keshawn Martin pass, but on their next possession Keenum was intercepted by Alan Ball. That turnover led to a Josh Scobee 40-yard field goal to give Jacksonville a 17-7 halftime lead. A Texans field goal in the third period was followed by an Ace Sanders touchdown pass to Jordan Todman, giving Jacksonville a two-touchdown lead at 24-10. Late in the third quarter Matt Schaub replaced Keenum and he promptly marched the Texans 76 yards in seven plays, with his five-yard touchdown pass to Garrett Graham narrowing the lead to seven at 24-17. Randy Bullock's second field goal got Houston closer early in the fourth period and on their next series the Texans threatened, using 14 plays to move 67 yards to the Jacksonville 12-yard line, but a failed fourth-down play ended the possession. Houston got the ball back with 2:21 remaining and no timeouts, but Schaub was intercepted by Geno Hayes to set up Scobee's 39-yard field goal for a 27-20 lead with 20 second left. Ryan Davis sacked Schaub on Houston's next play to end the game. The Jaguars rushed for a season-high 149 yards, including Jones-Drew's 103 with a 48-yard run. Andre Johnson, who was held to two catches earlier by the Jaguars defense, finished with 13 receptions for 154 yards but no touchdowns. Houston was penalized 14 times for 177 yards including 10 for 115 in the first half.

An ominous beginning portended a loss in which the Jaguars committed a season-high four turnovers, falling at home to the Bills 27-20. On the third play of the game Chad Henne was intercepted by Aaron Williams, and the 34-yard return set up Buffalo at the Jacksonville 25. The defense held the Bills to a field goal, which is what the Jaguars got after their first takeaway two series later following Geno Hayes' interception and 28-yard return to the Buffalo 33. The second quarter saw four scores with Henne throwing to Ace Sanders for a 12-yard touchdown, matched by EJ Manuel's seven-yard scoring pass to Robert Woods, capping a 94-yard drive, to make it 10-10 midway through the period. Buffalo took a 17-10 lead on its next possession on a Manuel eight-yard run, and after a Mike Brown fumble the Bills added a 40-yard field goal for a 20-10 halftime lead after scoring on three consecutive possessions to end the half. The second half began like the first for Jacksonville, with a turnover, when Denard Robinson ran 24 yards to the Buffalo one-yard line before fumbling into the end zone for a touchback. After forcing a Buffalo punt the Jaguars got within seven points on Josh Scobee's 55-yard field goal, his longest of the season. The Jaguars defense got its second takeaway on the Bills' next series when Winston Guy sacked Manuel and forced a fumble, which Sen'Derrick Marks recovered. The 55-yard drive capped by a 13-yard catch by Marcedes Lewis tied the score at 20-20 a minute into the fourth quarter. But the Bills quickly answered, marching 80 yards in nine plays to take a 27-20 lead on Manuel's one-yard toss to Frank Summers with 9:35 remaining in the game. The Jaguars responded, driving 75 yards in 15 plays to the Buffalo five-yard line. On third-and-goal Henne threw into the end zone but was picked off by Stephon Gilmore with 3:15 left. The Bills stopped the Jaguars on four downs on their final possession to seal the win. Jordan Todman, replacing the injured Maurice Jones-Drew, made his first career start and recorded his first 100-yard game with 109 yards on 25 carries and 44 yards on four receptions. Henne turned in his third straight game with multiple touchdown passes, and Marcedes Lewis had his third straight game with a touchdown catch. The Jaguars were without four starters, with Cecil Shorts III, Will Rackley and Johnathan Cyprien joining Jones-Drew on the sidelines.

Closing out the home portion of their schedule in what would be the final home game of veteran center Brad Meester's 14-year career, the Jaguars built a 16-6 lead before consecutive touchdown drives by Tennessee in the second half led to a 20-16 loss to the Titans. Tennessee ran for 182 yards, with Shonn Greene pounding out 91 and Chris Johnson 90, and Ryan Fitzpatrick threw for 181. The Titans scored on their second possession, a 64-yard drive that set up Rob Bironas' 45-yard field goal, but the Jaguars answered on the ensuing series going 80 yards in nine plays to take a 7-3 lead on Mercedes Lewis' four-yard catch. Tennessee got within 7-6 on Bironas' 52-yard field goal with 1:55 left in the second quarter, and once again the Jaguars responded on their next drive when Chad Henne's second touchdown pass was complete for seven yards to Mike Brown. The Titans' Bernard Pollard blocked the extra point try, costing the Jaguars a valuable point and leaving them with a 13-6 halftime lead. Josh Scobee capped their first possession of the second half with a 36-yard field goal to give the Jaguars their largest lead of the day at 16-6. Tennessee, however, then took control of the game with back-to-back touchdowns drives. An 11-play, 80-yard series was capped by Green's one-yard plunge, and after forcing a Jaguars punt the Titans drove 73 yards and took a 20-16 lead on Nate Washington's 30-yard scoring reception. The Jaguars' remaining possessions ended in a punt, a failed fourth-down attempt and an interception. They began their final series with 1:08 remaining and no timeouts and needing to drive 80 yards because of the four-point deficit. The teams combined for a total of just seven punts along with seven fourth-down conversion attempts, with Tennessee converting three of four and the Jaguars making one of three, and each team converted only three third-down plays on the day. Lewis posted his fourth straight game with a TD reception to tie the franchise record, while Henne turned in his fourth consecutive game with multiple touchdown passes. Andre Branch got one of the Jaguars' three sacks, marking his third straight game with a sack. Maurice Jones-Drew ran for 45 yards and became the 46th player in NFL history to rush for 8,000 yards.

Closing the season on the road against the AFC South Champion Colts, the Jaguars fell behind quickly and were unable to find the end zone until their final play of the game in a 30-10 loss. A rare Maurice Jones-Drew lost fumble, his first in 525 carries dating to 2011, on the third play of the game set up the Colts at the Jacksonville 42-yard line and led to a Donald Brown one-yard scoring run. After forcing a three-and-out the Colts marched again, going 54 yards for a two-yard touchdown run by Trent Richardson which made it 14-0 just 7:30 into the game. Another Jacksonville three-and-out gave the Colts the ball at their own 22, from where they drove 74 yards to the Jacksonville four-yard line before having to settle for an Adam Vinatieri field goal for a 17-0 lead late in the first quarter. The Jaguars finally scored three minutes into the second period on Josh Scobee's 37-yard field goal. Near the end of the first half Chad Henne was intercepted by Antoine Bethea at the Colts' 15 and his 46-yard return set up the Colts at the Jacksonville 39. On the final play of the half Indianapolis took a 20-3 lead on Vinatieri's 26-yard field goal. The Colts extended their lead to 27-3 on their first possession of the second half on Andrew Luck's seven-yard pass to Griff Whalen, capping an 80-yard drive. Midway through the fourth quarter Vinatieri kicked his third field goal of the day for a 30-3 advantage. The Jaguars' final possession of the season began at their own nine-yard line with 1:52 remaining in the game, and Henne marched the offense 91 yards in nine plays, connecting with Kerry Taylor for a 14-yard touchdown on the final snap. T.Y. Hilton finished with 11 receptions for 155 yards for the Colts, while Vinatieri became the fifth-leading scorer in NFL history and Robert Mathis took over the NFL lead with his two sacks giving him a league-best 19.5 for the year. The Jaguars finished at 4-12, turning in a 4-4 second half after an 0-8 start.
