TRANSACTIONS: Originally drafted in the second round (39th overall) of the 2014 draft.

**PRO:** First of two receivers selected by the Jaguars in the second round ... Became 24th WR selected by the Jaguars in franchise history, the fifth-highest in team history ... Marked the seventh USC player drafted by the Jaguars in team history, the second-most among any colleges (Florida, 8) ...

2014: 9/7 at PHI: Started at WR in NFL debut and tied for the team-lead with six catches for 62 yards with a long of 18. Joined Allen Hurns as first two rookie WRs to start in season-opener in franchise history ... 9/14 at WAS: Started at WR and had two receptions for 11 yards ... 9/21 at IND: Inactive (hamstring) ... 9/28 at SD: Inactive (hamstring) ... 10/5 vs. PIT: Inactive (hamstring) ... 10/12 at TEN: Returned to action after missing three games and finished with two receptions for 26 yards with a long of 16 yards ... 10/19 vs. CLE: Registered his longest reception of the season, a 20-yard grab in the second quarter. Also had two rushes for five yards ... 10/26 vs. MIA: Started at WR and had a nine-yard reception ... 11/2 at CIN: Saw action at WR ... 11/9 vs. DAL: Had a 13-yard reception ... 11/24 at IND: Led the team with 52 yards on three receptions (17.3 avg.) with a career-long 37-yard catch in the fourth quarter ... 11/30 vs. NYG: Started at WR and led team with six catches for 75 yards. Scored on a 30-yard TD pass from Blake Bortles in the third quarter, his first career score ... 12/7 vs. HOU: Started at WR and posted five receptions for 67 yards with a long of 31 yards, his third straight game with a 30-plus yard reception ...

COLLEGE: Three-year starter who declared for the NFL Draft following his junior season ... Čareer totals included 248 receptions for 3,655 yards (14.7 avg.) with 29 TDs ... Owns 24 school records and set five Pac-12 Conference marks ... Won the Biletnikoff Award as a sophomore as the nation's top receiver ... Ranked first in school history in receiving yards, second in receptions and fourth in receiving TDs ... Finished career with 101.53 average receiving yards per game ... Added 50 career kickoff returns for 26.1 avg. with two TDs and eight punt returns for 46 yards ... Was a long jumper and sprinter on USC's track team ...Started all 11 games as a junior and totaled 57 catches for 791 yards (13.9 avg.) with four TDs ... Added 164 yards on 10 kickoff returns, 46 yards on eight punt returns and seven yards on six carries ... Totaled 1,008 all-purpose yards ... Had three 100-yard receiving games and 32 first-down catches ... Became the school's first Biletnikoff Award winner as a sophomore as well as unanimous All-American and All-Pac 12 Conference first-team choice ... Named Pac 12 Offensive Player of the Year ... Started all 13 games and posted a single-season school and conference-record 118 receptions for 1,721 yards (14.6 avg.) with 14 TDs ... Registered eight 100-yard receiving games including a three-game stretch with 663 yards, the most yards in a three-game stretch in school history ... Had a school-record seven games with double-digit receptions ... Recipient of the Warfield Award and was a finalist for the Hornung Award and Walter Camp Award ... Finished fourth in the Heisman Trophy voting ... Won USC's MVP, Offensive Perimeter Player of the Year and John McKay Award ... Finished with 2,683 all-purpose yards (1,721 receiving, 106 rushing yards, 856 kickoff returns), the 15th-most in the nation ... Ranked second nationally in receptions per game (9.1, first in Pac-12) and receiving yards (132.4), third in all-purpose yards (206.4, first in Pac-12) and eighth in kickoff return average (28.5, first in Pac-12) ... Set the Pac-12 record with 345 kickoff return average (28.5, first in Pac-12) ... Set the Pac-12 record with 345 receiving yards (5th most in NCAA history) on 16 catches (3rd-most in Pac-12 history) against Arizona with two TDs (49 and 44 yards) including 12 catches for 255 yards in the first half and 469 all-purpose yards (2nd most in NCAA history) as he had 123 yards on three kickoff returns (including 72-yarder). Six of his catches went for 28-plus yards (57, 50, 49, 44, 32 and 28 yards) ... Posted 408 all-purpose yards vs. Oregon including a Pac-12 record 251 yards on a school-record eight kickoff returns and 157 yards with two scores on 12 receptions ... Started eight of 12 games as a freshman and ranked second on the team with 73 catches for 1,143 yards (15.7 avg.) and 11 TDs ... Gained 33 yards on five carries and 285 yards on 10 kickoff returns for 1,461 all-purpose yards. His 73 receptions were second-most in school history by a freshman yards ... His 73 receptions were second-most in school history by a freshman (Mike Williams, 81, 2002) ... Earned Freshman All-American honors by the Football Writers Association and the Sporting News.

PERSONAL: Single ... Attended Serra High School in Gardena, Calif. ... Lettered in football, basketball and track ... Earned Parade All-American as a senior as well as Super Prep All-American, Under Armour All-American, ESPNU 150, Rivals 100 and Prep Star Dream Team ... Finished with 57 receptions for 1,409 yards (24.7 avg.) with 24 TDs in final season along with 45 tackles and three INTs ... Led team to 14-1 mark and a berth in the California state Division II championship game ... Posted 89 tackles, six INTs, two fumble recoveries and a forced fumble as a junior while leading team to 15-0 mark and the California state Division III championship ... Was a sprinter and jumper on the track team, boasting a national prep No. 3 best 24-8 long jump, plus career bests of 44-7 in the triple jump, 6-4 in the high jump, 10.74 in the 100 meters and 22.11 in the 200 meters ... Named the 2010-11 Cal-Hi Sports Boys State Athlete of the Year and Cal-Hi Sports Boys Division IV Athlete of the Year ... Born in Inglewood, Calif. ... Full name: Margise Lee.
