PRO: Enters his fifth season as starter and 10th in the NFL ... Has played in 86 games with 76 starts with a 39-37 career record ... Career totals include 1,406 of 2,281 passing for 16,003 yards with 89 TDs and 54 INTs for an 85.8 passer rating ... Has 380 career rushes for 1,746 yards and 17 TDs ... One of only two players (Brad Meester) whose career started prior to Jack Del Rio taking over the helm in 2003 ... Since being named starting QB in 2007, he has a plus-30 TD to INT ratio (71 TDs/41 INTs) ... Has 10 career game-winning drives including four in 2010 ... Ranked third in the NFL from 2007-10 with fewest INTs (41) among QBs with minimum 1,500 attempts ... Ranks first in franchise history with 61.6 career completion percentage and second in yards, attempts, completions, passer rating and TD passes ... Set single-season franchise records for TD passes (23) and completion percentage (64.5) in 2010 ... Owns two of the top three single-season franchise marks for completion percentage, attempts and passer rating ... Holds the franchise record for consecutive games (8) without throwing an interception, consecutive pass completions (17) and most consecutive passes without an interception (209)... Has six career 300-yard passing games including a career-high 342 yards on Nov. 14, 2010 vs. Houston ... Has produced 28 100-plus rating games, 26 as a starter, and the Jaguars are 21-5 in those starts ... Registered 27 games with multiple TD passes and the Jaguars are 20-7 in those games ... Has eight career games with three or more TD passes ... One of only two QBs (Mark Brunell) in franchise history to have back-to-back 3,000-yard passing seasons and joins Brunell as only two QBs with 16,000 career passing yards ... Snapped streak of 38 consecutive starts in 2010, the longest streak in franchise history by a QB, after missing Oct. 24 at KC game with a concussion ... Ranked first among NFL QBs in rushing yards since 2007 with 1,109 and was first among all QBs in 2009 with career-high 323 rushing yards ... Finished with a career-high five rushing TDs in 2010, the most by a Jaguars QB in a season ... Ranked first in franchise postseason history with 76.4 career passer rating and ranked second with 486 passing yards, 62 attempts, 34 completions, three TDs and 54.8 completion percentage ... Set career-highs for comple-

tions (335), attempts (535) and yards (3,620) in 2008 ... Ranked third in the NFL in 2007 with a franchise-record 102.2 passer rating and finished as the NFL's best in third down passing (128.8) ... Led Jaguars to a 9-3 mark as a starter in 2007, the most wins by a Jaguars starter since Brunell posted a 13-2 record in 1999 ... Led Jaguars in 2007 to first postseason win since 1999 ... In 2007 finished with second-lowest interception percentage in a season for any quarterback in NFL history with 300-plus attempts, at 0.92 (3 ints. in 325 atts.) ... Owns 10-8 record in starts against NFC opponents ... Battled back from offseason surgery in his fight against Crohn's disease in 2004 ... One of only 12 players who have started at QB for Jaguars ... Third of five QBs drafted by Jaguars, following Rob Johnson (fourth round, 1995) and Jonathan Quinn (third round, 1998) and before Byron Leftwich (first round, 2003) and Blaine Gabbert (first round, 2011) ... Has played against 30 different NFL teams. The only team he has never played against is New Orleans ... Owns 25-18 record at home as a starter and 14-19 on the road ... Ranks second among Jaguars rookie QBs in attempts, completions and passing yards ...

2010: Started 14 games and missed two games with injuries ... Set single-season franchise records for touchdown passes (23) and completion percentage (64.5) ... Was 236 of 366 passing for 2,734 yards with 23 TDs and 15 INTs for a 90.8 rating ... Ranked second in NFL with 108.3 fourth quarter passer rating and seventh in completion percentage ... Completed 135 of 190 passes (73.8 pct.) with 19 TDs and five INTs for a 119.9 rating in the club's eight wins ... Finished with multiple TD passes in eight of 14 games (7-1 record) and became first QB in franchise history to throw for three or more TDs in four different games in a season ... Ranked third on the club with 279 yards on 66 carries with a career-high five TDs, the most TDs by a Jaguars QB in a season ... Established a franchise-record with 17 consecutive completions over a span of two games ... Had 39 completions of 20-plus yards with seven TDs ... Registered three of his top four career games for passer rating ... Had four game-winning drives including back-to-back games ... Completed at least 65 percent of his passes



in seven of 14 games including five games with 76-plus completion percentage ... **9/12 vs. DEN:** Opened season with three TDs on 16 of 21 passing for 170 yards. Set career-high with 138.9 passer rating and had five completions of 20-plus yards ... **9/19 at SD:** Finished 15 of 23 passing for 173 yards and one TD. Matched career-high with four INTs ... **9/26 vs. PHI:** Totaled 105 yards on 13 of 30 passing and had eight rushes for 23 yards ... **10/3 vs. IND:** Registered 77.3 completion percentage (17 of 22) and 163 yards passing with two TDs. Had five carries for a season-high 44 yards including a 25-yard TD run in the second quarter. Led team on game-winning drive from own 23-yard line with 48 seconds left that resulted in a 59-yard FG by Josh Scobee as time expired ... **10/10 at BUF:** Threw for 178 yards and three TDs on 16 of 20 passing (80.0 pct.). Connected with Mercedes Lewis for two TDs and found Mike Sims-Walker for a score ... **10/18 vs. TEN:** Was 7 of 12 passing for 49 yards and one INT before suffering a concussion in the second quarter and did not return ... Was inactive on **10/24 at KC**, snapping a streak of 38 consecutive starts ... **10/31 at DAL:** Returned to action and tossed a career-high four TD passes, tying a franchise-record, and set franchise record with 157.8 rating. Named AFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance. Finished 17 of 21 passing for 260 yards and hooked up with Lewis (42 and 9 yards), Sims-Walker (10 yards) and Mike Thomas (15 yards) for scoring plays. His passer rating was highest-ever against Dallas dating back to

1960. Completed first 12 passing attempts and didn't have first incompleton until early in third quarter, hitting on 10 of 10 passes for 126 yards with two TDs for a perfect 158.3 rating in the first half. Joined Peyton Manning (12/17/09) and Randall Cunningham (9/10/00) as only QBs since 2000 to complete every pass and throw for two TDs in the first half. Accounted for all five of the team's TDs as he scored on a two-yard run in the second quarter. Became only second QB since 1970 to throw for four TDs and rush for one in a road win (Trent Green, 2000) ... **11/14 vs. HOU:** Threw for a career-high 342 yards on 24 of 31 passing with two TDs for a 134.1 rating. Both TD passes were from 50-plus yards in the fourth quarter as he connected with Zach Miller from 52 yards and threw a game-winning 50-yard Hail Mary TD pass to Thomas as time expired. Was voted GMC NEVER SAY NEVER MOMENT OF THE WEEK. Marked first time in franchise history for two 50-plus yard TD passes in the same quarter and only second time in a game (9/22/96 at New England, Jimmy Smith, 51 yards; Andre Rison, 61 yards, both from Mark Brunell). Completed 14 straight passes to finish the game ... **11/21 vs. CLE:** Opened game with three straight completions to establish a franchise-record with 17 consecutive completions over a span of two games. Was 20 of 34 passing for 254 yards with two TDs and three INTs. Hooked up with Maurice Jones-Drew for a screen pass that went 75 yards, the longest completion of his career. Marked third straight game with multiple TD passes ... **11/28 at NYG:**

Completed 20 of 35 passes for 162 yards and one INT and scored on a five-yard run in the second quarter. Surpassed 15,000 career passing yards ... **12/5 at TEN:** Was 14 of 19 passing (73.7 pct.) for 126 yards and scored on a four-yard run ... **12/12 vs. OAK:** Threw for three TDs and tied Mark Brunell for single-season franchise record with 20. Connected with Lewis (1 yard), Jason Hill (48 yards) and Sims-Walker (10 yards) for TDs ... **12/18 at IND:** Completed 24 of 38 passes for 294 yards and two TDs which set a single-season franchise record ... **12/26 vs. WAS:** Was 22 of 38 passing for 299 yards with one TD and two INTs and recorded a 20-yard TD run in the fourth quarter. Joined Brunell as only QBs in franchise history to surpass 16,000 career passing yards ... Was placed on injured reserve on Dec. 31 with a finger injury and missed the season-finale at Houston ...

2009: Started all 16 games for the second consecutive season ... Replaced Indianapolis' Peyton Manning on AFC Pro Bowl roster ... Completed 314 of 516 passes for 3,597 yards with 15TDs and 10 INTs for a 83.5 rating ... Joined Mark Brunell as only QBs in franchise history with multiple 3,000-yard passing seasons and the only QBs to do it in back-to-back seasons ... The attempts, completions, yards and TDs were the second-most of his career ... Led all NFL QBs with career-high 323 rushing yards on 77 carries for three TDs ... The 77 rushes were the most by a Jaguars QB in team history ... Tied for 12th in NFL with career-high 29 completions of 25-plus yards, the second-most in team history ... Registered career-high three 300-yard passing games, tied for the second-most in team history (6, Brunell, 1996) ... Was one of 22 NFL QBs to attempt 400-plus passes and his 10 INTs were tied for fifth-fewest in the league ... Had streak of 155 consecutive passes without an INT, the fourth-longest streak in team history ... Directed three game-winning drives in the final seconds ... Became only second player in franchise history to record 1,000 career completions ... **11/8 vs. KC:** Posted a 110.7 passer rating with 264 yards including a career-long 61-yard TD pass to Mike Sims-Walker ... **11/15 at NYJ:** Led club on a 12-play, 80-yard drive to set up a 21-yard field goal by Scobee as time expired. Was four of six on the drive for 68 yards including a 33-yard strike to Lewis. Connected with Sims-Walker on a slant for a 26-yard TD in the second quarter ... **11/22 vs. BUF:** Led club to second consecutive comeback win. Completed four of five passes for 53 yards on the final drive to move the ball into Bills territory and then connected with Sims-Walker for a three-yard score with 56 seconds remaining. He converted the two-point conversion with a run up the middle ... **11/29 at SF:** Registered his third 300-yard passing game of the season with 307 yards on 25 of 36 passing for a 95.5 passer rating. The 73 rushes were the second-most rushes by a Jaguars QB in team history (80, Brunell, 1996) ... Posted first two 300-yard passing games of career ... Became fourth QB in franchise history to have two 300-yard passing games in a single season (Brunell, Leftwich, Gray) ... Registered career-best 42 completions of 20-plus yards with five TDs ... Was inactive for next three games on **10/28 at TB, 11/4 at NO** and **11/11 at TEN** (3rd QB) ... **11/18 vs. SD**: Returned to starting lineup and finished 15 of 24 passing (62.5 pct.) for 189 yards and two TDs for 114.8 passer rating ... **11/25 vs. BUF**: Established then career-high with 296 passing yards, completing 23 of 37 passes with a career-long 59-yard TD pass to Reggie Williams. Extended team record with his eighth consecutive game without an INT, and surpassed his own team record of 209 consecutive pass attempts without an INT ... **12/2 at IND**: Snapped team record streak of eight consecutive games without an INT, and ended his own team record with 230 consecutive pass attempts without an INT by Antoine Bethea on 22nd pass attempt of the game.
